



ADMISSIONS POLICIES

1. HOPE SPRINGS Christian Learning Center admits students of any race, color, national or ethnic origin.
2. At least one parent must be willing to sign the doctrinal statement and the parental agreement form.
3. The school reserves the right to deny admission to a child if his/her disability, behavior or emotional development indicates that he/she could not be best served by our school program.
4. The application should be accompanied by, a \$50.00 non-refundable service fee, current copy (not over 2 years old) of prior psychological testing*, copies of all prior school records, and a referral from a psychologist or doctor, if available.
5. Admission to HOPE SPRINGS Christian Learning Center will be determined after all admission requirements are met, including an interview of each family with the Admissions Committee. Notice of acceptance or non-acceptance will follow the interview session, usually by mail.
6. Admission will be final when the school receives all fees due and either payment for one year's tuition in advance, or the first monthly payment along with a signed copy of a loan agreement for the balance of the year's tuition.
7. Certification of Immunization (Form 3032) for all incoming students should be submitted before the first day of the school year. This form can be obtained either from your Doctor or the County Health Department. Students entering 6th grade must have a measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) booster before school starts.

PROGRAM POLICIES

- A. The HOPE SPRINGS Christian Learning Center serves students from ages 8 to 13 years of age.
- B. Instructional classes range in size from 4 to 6 students per teacher/therapist.
- C. Classes are organized according to skill level, rather than grade. Students are placed in homerooms on the basis of age.
- D. Therapy consists of one-to-one sessions two times per week for 55 minutes each. This is supplemented by three Rhythmic Writing practice sessions each week (10 to 15 minutes each) under the supervision of a therapist or trained therapy aide. In addition many NILD therapy techniques are used in the classroom throughout the day. All students enrolled in HOPE SPRINGS receive NILD therapy. Therapy is scheduled outside of academic hours: either from 8:15–9:10 a.m. or 2:15-3:10 p.m.
- E. Students must show evidence that they are covered by accident insurance.
- F. There will normally be an enrichment activity each week as a part of the KONOS curriculum. Each parent is asked to take responsibility for three or four enrichment activities per year.
- G. Parents are expected to attend all Parent Meetings and conferences. General information about learning disabilities and the policies of HOPE SPRINGS, as well as important announcements will be presented at these meetings.
- H. HOPE SPRINGS Christian Learning Center takes no responsibility for providing meals or transportation. A list of the names and addresses of parents is available in the HOPE SPRINGS office so those interested parents may arrange a car pool.
